**Letter from the Chairman Paul T. Williams, Jr.
& President/CEO David Banks**

Families in urban communities remain hungry for quality public education opportunities for their sons. Public schools sponsored by the Eagle Academy Foundation are the best evidence of this fact. In fall 2010, we received over 6,100 applications for 300 openings at our academies!

This past year, the young men attending our three Eagle Academies set a new standard of success, demonstrating high academic achievement, strong college success, and 100% commitment to their education. Eagle graduates are headed to such esteemed colleges and universities as Carnegie Mellon University, Morehouse College, and Lawrence University. We are thrilled by our first student to gain admission to the United States Military Academy at West Point. Such academic achievement is especially impressive given that the vast majority of students coming to Eagle Academies begin their careers performing well below grade level.

FY 2011 was filled with other markers of success. The opening of a state-of-the-art \$50 million school facility for our flagship Eagle Academy of the Bronx demonstrated the City's confidence in our programs. The young scholars at the Eagle Academy of Ocean Hill experienced outstanding academic growth – with 84% of 8th graders reading at grade level, compared to 17% just two years earlier. Eagle Academy of Southeast Queens welcomed its first class of 6th graders, and boasted 96% attendance throughout the year.


We provided the added value resources - extended day, summer programs, parent workshops, and mentoring – that differentiate Eagle Academies from other public schools and enable our students to grow as upstanding individuals and as scholars. We also provided professional training to more than 300 educators from public school systems in New Orleans, Philadelphia and Detroit, among others, to spread the successful lessons set into action at Eagle Academies to educators across the country.


Raising the educational attainment of inner city young men is a critical national issue, and the Eagle Academy Foundation is at the front line of the solution. Our leadership played a major role in developing Mayor Bloomberg's bold policy initiative for Black and Latino males in New York City, announced in August 2011.

In the coming months, we will embark on an exciting new expansion. At the behest of Newark Mayor Cory Booker, we plan to open the first Eagle Academy in New Jersey in September 2012. We will also expand our Professional Development Institute to year-round offerings.

WHAT WE DO: Mission

Founded in 2005, The Eagle Academy Foundation develops and supports a network of all male, grades 6 through 12, college-preparatory schools in challenged, urban communities that educate and mentor young men into future leaders committed to excellence in character, scholastic achievement and community service, and promotes these principles nationally.

HOW WE DO IT: Programs

Eagle Model

A disciplined and purpose-driven approach, designed specifically for inner city young men, built around Eagle core values of character, integrity, lifelong learning, partnership, and responsibility.

Academic Enrichment: Our goal is a 100% high school graduation rate of a rigorous college prep curriculum. Individualized education plans and complete intervention and remediation services are tailored for each Eagle scholar, including high achievers, those with learning disabilities, and ESL students.

Parent Engagement: Workshops and programs designed to engage parents in their children's academic life and provide them with the tools and skills they need to be active and supportive partners. Planned in conjunction with Saturday programs for Eagle scholars.

College Prep: A comprehensive and systematic approach starting in 6th grade to ensure Eagle students maximize their opportunity to be accepted to college and are college-ready.

Extended Day: After-school tutoring and a rich co-curricular program of athletics, arts, and science extend the Eagle Day to 6 pm. Saturday programs, held over 25 weekends, develop life skills and character for Eagle scholars and families.

Mentoring: Dedicated men are matched with Eagle scholars to help foster academic and personal growth. Eagle students gain additional support and learn to be role models through required peer-to-peer mentoring.

Summer Bridge: All new Eagle scholars attend a summer academic enrichment program, which translates to increased success in school.

Rituals: Uniforms, daily meetings and the Eagle credo help Eagle scholars to unite under a shared set of values and goals of academic excellence.

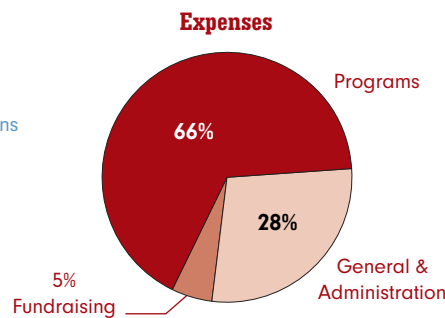
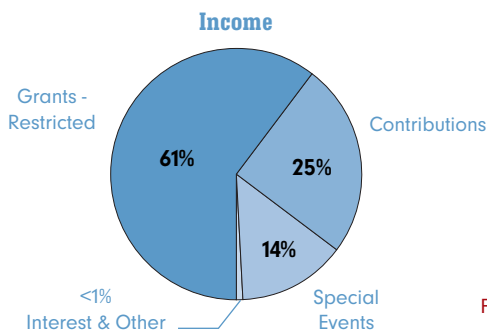
Professional Development Institute

A dynamic national program to increase public discourse and improve the educational outcomes of young boys in urban school systems across the country. Includes professional development training, conferences, workshops, and technical assistance. Served more than 300 educators and thought leaders from urban public school systems across the country in 2010-2011.

WHAT WE ACHIEVED: Success

- **87% graduation rate** for Eagle Academy of the Bronx Class of 2011
- **90%** of Eagle Academy graduates go on to **college**
- Class of 2011 awarded **more than \$275,000** in **college scholarships and fellowships**
- Eagle graduates have matriculated at the **U.S. Military Academy at West Point, Carnegie Mellon University, Morehouse College, Skidmore College, and Syracuse University**
- **84% college retention rate**
- **84%** of Eagle Academy of Ocean Hill 8th graders are **reading at or above grade level** - up from 17% when they first entered the Academy as 6th graders.
- **70%** of Eagle Academy of Ocean Hill 8th graders have passed at least one **NY State Regents examination**
- **25%** have already passed **three Regents**. Five Regents exams are required to receive the prestigious Regents high school diploma
- Eagle Academy of Ocean Hill **received an A on the NYC DOE report card** – outperforming 85% of the middle schools in NYC
- **100% of teachers** at Eagle Academy of Southeast Queens feel supported by their principal
- Eagle Academy of Southeast Queens boasted an average **96% attendance rate**
- A 4th Eagle Academy to open in **Newark, NJ** in September 2012
- **300 educators** from **100 different schools** attended Eagle’s 2010 PDI conference
- Eagle Academy Foundation President/CEO **David C. Banks appointed by Mayor Bloomberg** to lead New York City’s groundbreaking Young Men’s Initiative

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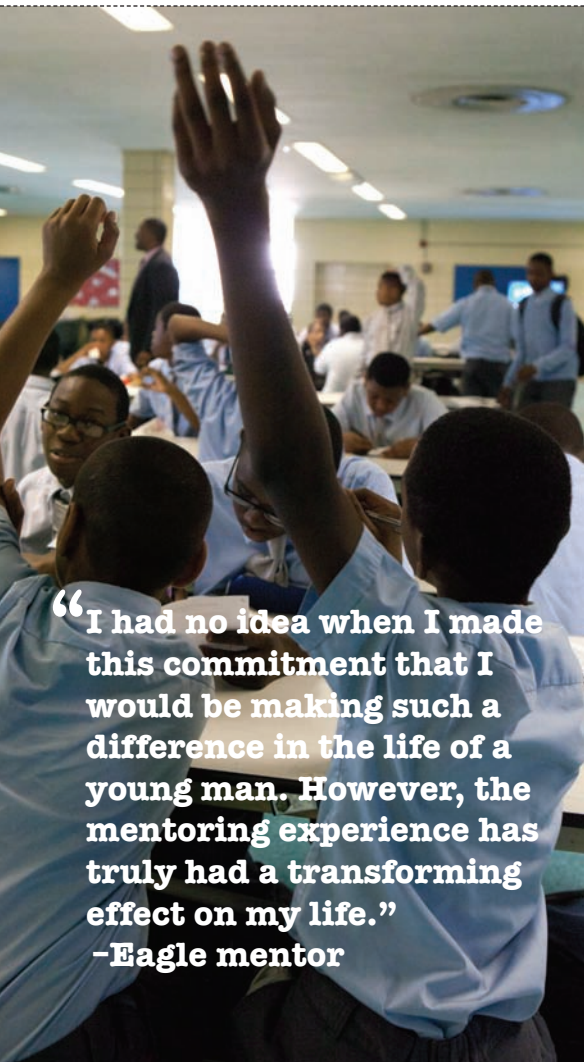
